"I fell in love with the elderly people I helped there and the rest is kind of history. Time has really flown by. That was 15 years ago." Gallegly is now an advanced practice registered nurse at Naadi Healthcare Vascular and Interventional Center.

After that first MA experience the degrees kept coming. She earned her LPN then went to Rose State for her RN.

through the University of South Alabama. She's dual certified in family and adult gero acute care.

"I have always felt like nursing was my calling. I prayed for direction and I ended up in a career filled with empathy and compassion," she said. "I get to form unique bonds with patients and their families, and I get to empower people to take control of their health and lead healthier lives. It's a challenge every day but it is so rewarding."

After she graduated with her NP, a friend working at Naadi reached out and told her she would be a good fit working with Dr. C.V. Ramana.

One year later she loves what she does.

The majority of Naadi patients present with peripheral artery disease. Along with that comes a slew of comorbidities such as diabetes, hypertension and obesity.

"All of those things lend to peripheral artery disease and they can cause things like immobility, critical limb ischemia and sometimes amputation," she said. "It's really rewarding to be able to restore people's mobility and help them to get active again and back to a better standard of health."

Gallegly treats patients who have been dealing with wounds from a few months to a few years. Treating the wound from the inside out by restoring blood flow is the key component.

"Our clinic is one of a kind in the state of Oklahoma," she said. "They're popular in other states but in Oklahoma it's new and innovative and I'm excited to be a part of that."

Naadi specializes in peripheral vascular disease and venous insufficiency.

From pain in the calf while walking to non-healing wounds, Naadi works on getting people back to their former selves.

"Ultimately, the end goal is if somebody has a really bad wound we don't want them to lose their limb. We want to save their limb, save their life. People who have amputations have a very high mortality rate," said Shelby Dudley, a radiology technologist at Naadi.

Naadi Vascular and Interventional Center is the first outpatient center in Oklahoma City dedicated to vascular and interventional radiology.

Interventional radiology (also known as IR) is the minimally invasive, image-guided treatment of medical conditions that once required open surgery.

Breakthroughs in technology and imaging have created new treatment choices for patients. In this new era of medicine, there is no longer one "right way" to handle your condition.

Personalized medicine means doing the right thing for each individual patient. More than ever, it's imperative for you to know and understand all of the available options to treat your condition or disease. In many cases, there is a minimally invasive approach that could dramatically reduce your pain, risk and recovery time.

"That's something I hope we can make a change in the culture," Ramana said. "People see all of that as a normal part of growing old and kind of accept that and don't think there is anything they can do to impact that."

"One of the nice things about being in a facility like this is you get to see those patients over and over and you get to see how you've impacted their lives," Ramana said. "It's very rewarding."

Gallegly one day hopes to work towards independent practice.

But she's more than happy where she's at right now.

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Sooner SUCCESS recently received recognition for its comprehensive efforts to support children with special needs and their families. In a proclamation made by Governor Kevin Stitt, Nov. 30 was declared "Sooner SUCCESS Day" in the state of Oklahoma.

Sooner SUCCESS is a statewide program under the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine Department of Pediatrics' Child Study Center. It was established in 2002, to help make services more widely known and accessible to families of children with special healthcare needs. The needs may be behavioral, developmental and/or medically related. Often, the needs are multiple or overlapping, making coordination of services potentially more complex.

"For 17 years, Sooner SUCCESS has helped families navigate their way through a maze of sometimes disparate agencies and organizations," said Aietah Stephens, executive director of the program. "We implement

community programming that meets the unique needs of families that have a child or loved one with special healthcare needs. We actively work on community coalitions to increase awareness of needs and strive to create more inclusive communities."

According to a national survey conducted in 2009-2010, Oklahoma has a higher percentage of children with special healthcare needs – 17.6%, as compared to 15.1% nationally. Sooner SUCCESS provides one-on-one assistance to help families secure appropriate support resources for their children with special needs.

One area in which Sooner SUCCESS has seen excellent results is its commitment to connect caregivers to respite care services, identified as a top need of caregivers. A caregiver is an individual who may have full-time or nearly full-time responsibility caring for another person. # What is Metabolic Syndrome?

syndrome is a Metabolic combination of risk factors that increase the likelihood of developing heart disease, diabetes, and stroke. These risk factors include high blood pressure, high blood sugar levels, excess body fat (particularly around the waist), high triglyceride levels and low levels of good cholesterol. Having only one of these risk factors does not mean that you have metabolic syndrome, however, having one will increase the possibly of developing Having cardiovascular disease. three or more will likely result in a diagnosis of metabolic syndrome. The two critical risk factors for diagnosing metabolic syndrome is excess central body fat and insulin resistance.

The American Heart Association reports that approximately 25 percent of the American population has metabolic syndrome. То diagnose metabolic syndrome your primary care provider will perform tests to look for signs of the disorder. These tests may include a baseline blood pressure measurement, waist circumference measurement, a fasting lipid panel, and a fasting glucose level. Complications of metabolic syndrome include hardening of the arteries, peripheral artery disease, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, heart attack, kidney disease and stroke.

If you think you are at risk for metabolic syndrome, see your primary care provider for an examination and screening. Metabolic syndrome is treatable and the poor outcomes related to living with the disorder for many years are avoidable. Your primary care provider can provide support
