HISTORIC SIGNING CREATES NEW HEALTH SYSTEM FOR OKLAHOMA

Oklahoma health care takes a major step forward with the historic agreement signed today between the University of Oklahoma and University Hospitals Authority and Trust to merge their clinics and hospitals into Oklahoma's first comprehensive academic health system - OU Health.

"Today marks an extraordinary moment decades in the making for Oklahoma in our quest to become a healthier state," said OU President Joseph Harroz Jr. "The healthiest states have one thing in common: an academic health system that brings together patient care, research and the training of tomorrow's health care leaders. Before today, we had each of those pieces, and while they worked together, they operated separately with different management structures. Now, this merger unlocks unlimited potential as we bring together research-driven care and education that will make Oklahomans healthier, lead to economic prosperity and move our state forward."

The merger creates new, singular leadership, operational and financial functions. As a result, OU Health will offer a seamless patient experience, improve care outcomes, and provide more access to the latest treatments found nowhere else in the state.

"As an academic health system, we now have all key participants at the table making strategic decisions for a single enterprise," said G. Rainey Williams, Jr., Board Chair of University Hospitals Authority and Trust. "This merger aligns OU Health with the healthcare model that has proven successful in enhancing healthcare for the healthiest

Virginia and Israel. "I moved to New Mexico and then to Oklahoma for college in 1994 where I married an Okie boy and settled here to raise a family."

"When I was a little girl, my practical career choices were always between teaching and nursing. A few years ago, I got to a place where I wanted and needed a change, and nursing was what I wanted to do next. God opened the right doors and I simply walked through them. I feel so blessed to be able to do both of my top career choices in my lifetime. My dad was a nurse; one of those great nurses. He is a huge inspiration to me and he always helps me learn nursing concepts that I need

"Going to nursing school was an especially rewarding part of my life. I loved being there. I found something that I was legitimately passionate about. I enjoyed learning about anatomy, physiology and the medical technology. I love patient care and want to learn everything about it all! My hard work was recognized with an award for academic excellence that I was presented with in front of my I had great instructors, class. family and friends that helped me through nursing school. My biggest cheerleaders were my husband, my parents and best friend, Kari. Every time I talked to Kari, she was very encouraging. She would call me the best nurse in the world, even when I started school," Kendra said with a laugh. "Everyone should have a best friend like Kari."

On a personal note, Kendra has been married for twenty-three years to her wonderful and supportive husband, Barry. They have two teenagers, a daughter, Arwyn, who will be a senior this year and a son, Coen, who will be a sophomore. "Being a teacher off and on for years, along with being a stay-at-home mom was good for me. Now, I'm ready for my second career," Kendra stated.

"My hobbies include dance classes and going kayaking. I love roller-coasters, (the scarier, the better) and roller-skating. I am very interested in trying kite boarding. I do not like cooking at all! I would describe myself as friendly and authentic. I love being in my forties. I wish I could put my forty year old mind in my twenty year old body though. Why does everything hurt now?"

How would you describe yourself in three words? "Keep moving forward! I want to tell people they are not stuck. We have this culture where we are expected to figure out what we want to do and who we want to be right out of high school, doing it for the rest of our lives. I say you can be as many different things as you want to be. My mama taught me that."

states in our nation and will propel our campus for the next 50 years."

The merger also brings the research and education missions of the enterprise into closer alignment with the care of patients. Enhanced collaborations between physicians and researchers will transform patient care as they search for new answers to complex medical problems. In addition, the new organization will reinvest clinical earnings into research and educational activities.

Executive Dean of the College of Medicine Dr. John Zubialde added: "This is an exciting new era in the history of the OU College of Medicine. Oklahomans will benefit from the latest in research-driven advancements and increased access to health care, and the next generation of OU-trained physicians will carry our tradition of excellence into the future."

While the official merger and signing is a long-awaited achievement for OU Health, growth and changes have already been underway, even during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic. The new eight-story North Tower of the OU Health University

of Oklahoma Medical Center opened in fall 2020, bringing 144 additional beds, 32 new operating rooms and advanced technologies. There is also an ongoing modernization of IT infrastructure and the implementation of Epic, the new electronic health record that will facilitate conversation among healthcare providers across the enterprise. "The official signing of the merger represents the culmination of a vision, but it is only the beginning of our growth and the innovations that will be developed to address the healthcare needs of Oklahomans," said Senior Vice President and Provost of the OU Health Sciences Center and Acting Board Chair of OU Medicine, Inc. Jason Sanders, M.D., MBA. "We already have assets found nowhere else in the state - such as the National Cancer Institute-Designated Stephenson Cancer Center; a Level 1 Trauma Center; and Oklahoma Children's Hospital, a comprehensive facility for children and mothers. The future is even brighter because of a merger that optimizes our ability to provide the highest quality of care to everyone who needs our services."

Just for Seniors is a licensed companion-sitter agency providing services to help families care for aging loved-ones. We provide a variety of "rent-a-daughter" services that help fill-in for families when busy schedules will not allow. Our goal is to keep the seniors you love living safely and comfortably at home without the need for a care facility.

Our passion is getting seniors out of the house and engaged in the community while they still can. We love working with seniors to find fun and stimulating activities that get them excited and improve their quality of life. - *Just for Seniors*

Just for Seniors has been in business since August 20, 2012. Deborah Wallace started the business because her mom needed someone to help her. "It was after my dad passed away, my mom had several small strokes and could no longer drive. I was working at Chesapeake at the time so taking time off during the day was very challenging. Trying to handle things in the evenings and weekends was exhausting. I was also very concerned that she was spending most of her time in the house watching TV. I wanted her to at least get a change of scenery on a routine basis. I needed someone to take her to the beauty shop every week and to lunch a couple days a week. I needed someone to take her grocery shopping and run errands so I didn't have to do it on my time off. All the commercial options we found had a three to four hours service minimum. That

was more action than she could handle. Ultimately, we were able to find someone privately to help her, but I knew there was a need," Deborah explained.

Currently, we are the only Just for Seniors; we are not a franchise. There are six part-time employees, five in the OKC metro area and one in Stillwater. Officially, they are called, Just for Seniors Associates. "Unofficially, they are called, Rent-a-Daughter/Son," Deborah said with a smile. "We have approximately ninety clients signed up to use our service. Roughly, thirty to forty people use us each month."

Deborah grew up in Oklahoma. "My dad was a Methodist minister so we moved around Oklahoma every three to four years. I was born in Lawton and lived in Chickasha, Choctaw, Hugo, OKC, Weatherford, Pryor and Guymon before graduating OU in 1988. I moved to Houston, staying there until 2007 when I returned to OKC to help my parents. That was quite a few moves! I currently live in Bethany and plan on staying here

for a while," she said.

Starting high school in Weatherford, OK, Deborah graduated high school in Pryor, OK. She earned her undergrad BBA in Management Information Systems from OU. She earned her graduate MBA in Finance and International Business via night school from the University of Houston.

Deborah wears many hats as a business owner and says that each day is dramatically different. "After spending twenty-five years in an office, I try to spend as little time as possible in the office now," she said. "My office time is usually focused on accounting and administrative activities," Deborah said. "I am the primary marketer so I am responsible for networking and marketing activities. I work with families to find resources that address their loved ones' needs. I still do some caregiving so I might be helping a client with something," she added.

Asking Deborah what her biggest reward is from Just for Seniors, she

Hillcrest also offers up to \$2,500 per semester in tuition reimbursement for career advancement. Relocation and sign-on bonuses are also available for new grads.

"Not a lot of facilities in the area offer both of those things for a new grad," Trujillo said.

The system is a large one but time and attention is spent on onboarding new hires and making sure they feel comfortable.

"We've put a lot of time and effort

into it to make sure the new grad feels safe. It's a lot of detail-oriented training," Trujillo said. "I think we've narrowed down the reasons why nurses quit, leave or leave the profession all together is because they don't feel adequately trained enough to do their job or they feel unsafe.





Study shows strawberries lower serious health risks



A study led by Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation physician-scientist Hal Scofield, M.D., found that 2.5 servings of strawberries per day can lessen the risk of heart disease, stroke and diabetes.

As little as 130 calories per day could make a significant impact on your cardiovascular health.

approximately how many calories are in about 2.5 cups of strawberries. And it's the amount a new study led by Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation physician-scientist Hal Scofield, M.D., found is needed to lessen our risk of heart disease, stroke and diabetes.

"This is the ideal health finding," said Scofield, a physician and medical researcher in OMRF's Arthritis and Clinical Immunology Research Program. "Strawberries don't require a prescription, and they're available year-round."

Previous work in Scofield's lab showed that strawberries could have a positive impact on health. But in the new study published in the journal Nutrients, researchers were surprised to find that such a reasonable amount of the berries could make a difference.

Scofield found that in people obesity, the daily consumption of 32 grams of freeze-dried strawberry powder mixed with water (the equivalent of about 14 oz. of fresh strawberries) lowered participants' blood glucose, improved good lipids and reduced LDL cholesterol, all factors for heart attack and stroke. Study participants also showed improved insulin resistance, an underlying cause of Type 2 diabetes.

But like the omega-3 fatty acids in fish, the researchers found the natural compounds in strawberries to be most beneficial when consumed as part of a

"We know that eating fish has more health benefits than taking fish oil pills. This appears to be the same for strawberries," said Scofield, noting that freezedried, powdered berries retain aren't certain why, but it supports the idea that eating real, whole foods is important."

Scofield's lab has previously shown that strawberries are an effective anti-inflammatory measure to reduce pain associated with osteoarthritis, the leading cause of disability and joint replacements in adults in the U.S.

"The idea that strawberries have anti-inflammatory and hearthealthy compounds is not new, but applying the benefits directly to specific diseases is," said

the nutrients of fresh berries. "We Scofield. "The bottom line is to eat well. We're supposed to eat five servings of fruits and veggies a day. This is just one more indicator that the benefits of that are real."
